

**BOROUGH OF MEDIA
PUBLIC HEARING MINUTES
DECEMBER 18, 2003**

CABLE FRANCHISE AGREEMENT

President Hagan mentioned that Comcast Cable Communications, Inc. currently holds a franchise from the Borough and has requested a renewal of its franchise to maintain, construct, operate and upgrade it's cable system within the Borough rights-of way.

Bill Tyson, 325 N. Edgmont Street, noted he supports the proposed cable franchise agreement and believes Comcast to be a good corporate neighbor.


President Hagan mentioned she appreciates the perks that Comcast provides to the Borough such as free video taping of the monthly Council meetings by Dave Brown.

Tony DiTomasso, Government & Community Relations Director for Comcast, introduced himself and mentioned they serve approximately 550 municipalities. Mr. DiTomasso also introduced Todd Silbergeld as the Regional Director of Government & Community Relations for Comcast. Mr. DiTomasso mentioned as a result of this ten (10) year agreement, the Borough will receive a high speed internet access and a cash grant to purchase much needed equipment for communication with Borough residents (i.e. new sound system for Council Chambers, new computer for cable channel, etc.)

Mayor McMahon thanked Tony DiTomasso and Comcast Cable for their support at various events throughout the Borough. Comcast's support is greatly appreciated.

Vice-President Robinson made a motion to adjourn the Public Hearing. Councilperson Whitaker seconded the motion. Motion carried unanimously. The Public Hearing adjourned at 8:05 p.m.


1. Road Resurfacing Improvements
