

**MINUTES
BOROUGH COUNCIL MEETING
JUNE 17, 2010**

Media Borough Council met in Council Chambers on the above date with the following officials present: Mayor McMahon, President Williamson, Vice-President Simpson, Councilwomen Rehoric and Roe, Councilmen Cunningham, Stein and Alyanakian. Also present were Borough Manager Smith, Treasurer Deitch, Solicitor Scott and Engineer Walton.

President Williamson called the meeting to order at 7:30 p.m. and led the salute to the flag.

President Williamson observed a moment of silence for Jim Jeffery's father, Reginald Jeffery. Councilman Cunningham also mentioned that Mr. Jeffery was a former Upper Providence Township commissioner in the 1970's.

Approval of the Minutes

Councilwoman Simpson mentioned a revision to the May 6, 2010 Workshop meeting minutes to reflect that Monika Rehoric seconded the motion to adjourn the meeting. Councilwoman Simpson made a motion to adopt the May 6, 2010 Workshop meeting minutes with the revision as stated above. Councilman Cunningham seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously.

Councilwoman Roe made a motion to adopt the May 20, 2010 Council meeting minutes. Vice-President Simpson seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously.

Public Comment and Privilege of the Floor

Moira Kern, Second Street, requested that Borough Council consider small businesses along State Street west of Orange Street during Super Sunday events and allow Orange Street to be blocked off for the events. Councilwoman Roe responded that Borough Council is working with the Media Business Authority on this matter and should be in a position to vote next month.

Zubair Khan, Executive Director of the Media Business Authority, thanked residents and visitors for the very successful Blues Stroll event. Mr. Khan mentioned that this was one the best Blues Stroll event with regard to talent and attendance.

Mr. Khan mentioned that the Media Business Authority has refreshed the juror discount program. New window clings will appear at participating businesses.

Tina Mason, Community Action Agency of Delaware County (CAADC), provided a detailed overview of their Weatherization Assistance Program. Mrs. Mason mentioned that the CAADC is an anti-poverty agency offering the Weatherization Assistance Program free to all qualified residents. Mrs. Mason requested that Council spread the word about the program and indicated that applications are available online and at the Borough Hall.
